#### Rationale

The archipelagic structure of the Philippines and its strategic geographic location allows it to host a wide range of habitat-types and prompts the country to be a hotspot for biodiversity. It is one of the 17 most biodiverse countries in the world according to Conservation International in 1998. It is also is considered to be the richest marine eco-region in the world or the Center of Marine Shorefish Diversity, being situated at the apex of the Coral Triangle. Despite this, the country is faced with threats that has been going on for decades in the form of unsustainable practices that cause wildlife population decline and habitat loss. Almost 93 percent of the original forest cover has already been lost since the 1990's. Overfishing of the Philippine reefs have also significantly reduced demersal fish stocks, compounded even further by the effects of declining coral cover. The economic pressures of a developing country have placed its natural resources at stake, with environmental conditions deteriorating at a rapid rate which may soon be irreversible.

For this reason, the government adopts the National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (NBSAP) as pursuant to the Presidential Memorandum Order (MO) 285, issued in 1995, as is Executive Order (EO) of 2006. The NBSAP shall serve as the basis of national policy on biodiversity and directs all concerned government agencies and offices and local government units (LGUs) to integrate and mainstream the protection, conservation, and sustainable use of biodiversity into their policies, rules, and regulations, programs, and development planning processes. The formulation of NBSAP also reinforces our commitments to international agreements, primarily inaugurated at the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) during the 1992 Earth Summit in Brazil.

The country has currently been implementing its Philippine Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (PBSAP) for 2015-2028, which is the third in a series of iterations since the Philippines' ratification of the CBD. This latest iteration integrates the Aichi Biodiversity Targets, which outlines the a set of 20, time-bound, measureable targets agreed by the Parties to the CBD in Nagoya, Japan, in October 2010, that are now being translated into revised national strategies and action plans by the 193 Parties to the Convention. Overall, the enactment of PBSAP from national to local levels is to ultimately achieve its vision, that "By 2028, biodiversity is restored and rehabilitated, valued, effectively managed and secured, maintaining ecosystem services to sustain healthy, resilient Filipino communities and delivering benefits to all."

The DENR-BMB, with the mandate to implement and mainstream PBSAP with the programs and plans of national government agencies and local government units (DAO 2016-12), has since pushed forward its localization to different regions of the country following the prioritization of the same 20-point Aichi Biodiversity Targets. Partner organizations such as UNDP, through the Biodiversity Financing Initiative (BioFin), provide assistance in resource mobilization of finance

solutions that can fund projects involving biodiversity conservation. These can be sourced from the local and national budget, as well as from external resource entities including the private sector. USAID's Protect Wildlife Project also work in close consultation with the local government and stakeholders, and renders technical assistance in the formulation of the local BSAP in priority conservation areas throughout the country, one of which is Zamboanga Sibugay.

Zamboanga Sibugay is a province within the Zamboanga Peninsula (Region 9) located at 7°48′N latitude and 122°40′E longitude, named after its major river, the Sibugay River. The province surrounds Sibugay Bay, a rich estuarine and marine resource consisting of extensive wetlands, seagrass beds, and reef habitats. The province has two (2) ENIPAS-listed protected areas: Buug Natural Biotic Area (BNBA) in the municipality of Buug; and Dumanquillas Bay Protected Landscape and Seascape (DBPLS) whose jurisdiction is shared with the neighboring province Zamboanga del Sur. There are numerous MPAs covering an aggregate area of 5775 ha, one is within a recognized KBA — Bangaan Island. Several local conservation sites are also in place to protect the remaining flora and fauna in the province, along with the ecosystem services that they provide. Based on the list of priority species in protected areas (under BMS-LAWIN), there are at least 46 threatened species of birds, mammals, amphibians, reptiles, and plants within the ENIPAS alone in Zamboanga Sibugay.

Establishing additional protection nodes such as the proposed Naga—Kabasalan Protected Landscape, baselining and monitoring of important lifeforms, and strengthening the capabilities and resources of the local biodiversity custodians are just some of the strategies that were forwarded in the formulation of this plan. The involvement of multi-sectoral stakeholders, including IP communities, farmer and fisherfolk POs, academe, even encouraging private enterprises to assist in the implementation of the biodiversity plan, ensures that the approach to conservation is holistic and contributes to both environmental and economic well-being of Zamboanga Sibugay.

# Brief profile of Zamboanga Sibugay

Zamboanga Sibugay (7°48′N 122°40′E) is one of the south-facing provinces beneath the arc of Zamboanga peninsula (Region 9), situated west of Mindanao. It was formerly the third district of Zamboanga del Sur until it received its status of a sovereign province by virtue of Republic Act No. 8973 effective February 24, 2001, with Ipil designated as capital. The neighboring provinces which constitutes the rest of Region 9 are Zamboanga del Norte to the north, Zamboanga del Sur on its east, and Zamboanga City on its southwest. Zamboanga Sibugay faces the Sibugay Bay to the south which then merges to the larger Moro Gulf further southward.

There are a total of sixteen (16) municipalities, of which thirteen are coastal while three are inland (Imelda, Diplahan, and Titay). Ten coastal municipalities are part of the landmass adjoining Mindanao (from west to east: Tungawan, R.T. Lim, Ipil, Naga, Kabasalan, Siay, Payao, Alicia, Malangas, and Buug), whereas three of the coastal municipalities (Mabuhay, Olutanga, and Talusan) rests on a separate island on the southeast.

The total land area of Zamboanga Sibugay is at 360,775 ha, or 22.6% of the whole Region 9. The western-most province, Tungawan, comprises the largest land coverage at 47,328 ha, while Talusan on the far southeast has the smallest with only 5,816 ha<sup>1</sup>. In terms of terrain, the highest peak is at Mount Silingan (Ipil) which stands at 893 masl. Other major landforms are Mount Lacauwan (R. T. Lim), Mount Sibuguey, Mount Logona, and Tamaraw Mountains (Payao), Mount Kabasalan (Kabasalan), and Mount Kaladis (Alicia).

The number of inhabitants within the province totals at 633,129 individuals as of 2015. Its capital, Ipil, has the highest population of 78,656, whereas Imelda has the least with only 28,018. Talusan, with its limited land area, has the highest population density of 515.29 persons per sq. km., despite having a population of only 29,969.

#### Climate

The prevailing climate in Zamboanga Sibugay is classified as Type III based on the Modified Coronas' Climate Classification, wherein the seasons are not very pronounced, although November to April is relatively dry while it is wet for the rest of the year. Eastern portions of the province consisting of Alicia, Malangas, and Buug, may also experience Type IV climate where rainfall is more or less evenly distributed throughout the year. The annual rainfall may range from around 1,599 mm to 3,500 mm. Temperature readings vary from 22°C to 35°C, but is generally warm and constant throughout the year.

The province is rarely visited by typhoons since its location is away from the country's typhoon belt. However, severe monsoon rains may cause major rivers to overflow and bring floods to low-lying communities such as those in Sibuguey Valley.

# **Biodiversity Assets**

#### Protected Areas (ENIPAS)

#### Buug Natural Biotic Area (BNBA)

(7°43'30" - 7°48'00" N; 123°01'30" - 123°06'00" E)

As of date, the province has one (1) nationally-recognized protected area – Buug Natural Biotic Area, which covers 1,261 ha of biodiverse forestland situated at the northeastern portion of the municipality of Buug. Its protection and management is pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act 11038 or ENIPAS Act of 2018. BNBA was formerly known as Buug Watershed Forest Reserve under Proclamation No. 81 in August 9, 1996. It was then formally classified as a biotic area under Proclamation No. 63 on December 22, 1998.

The area is flourished with inadequately stock natural Dipterocarp forest typically in areas within the Strict Protection Zone (SPZ) that serve as a niche, nesting and breeding ground of birds, reptiles, amphibian, mammals and other insects. Some areas within the Multiple-Use Zone (MUZ) that are under rehabilitation have stands of exotic, fast-growing tree species such as Falcata, Mahogany, and Gmelina. The rolling to steep terrains of BNBA have an elevation that ranges from 200 to 600 masl, and is covered with vegetation that provides habitat to a number of important species, including endemics such as Mindanao flying squirrel *Petinomys crinitus*, Mindanao bleeding-heart *Gallicolumba crinigera*, and Mindanao horned frog *Megophrys stejnegeri*.

Several endemic species in the biotic area are also considered threatened, such as the Golden-crowned fruit bat *Acerodon jubatus* (CR/critically endangered), Mindanao hornbill *Penelopides affinis* (EN/endangered), Rabor's horned tree frog *Platymantis rabori* (VU/vulnerable), Southern Philippine temple pit viper *Tropidolaemus philippensis* (OTS/other threatened species), and Almaciga *Agathis philippinensis* (VU). DENR's Biodiversity Monitoring System (BMS-LAWIN) has identified 83 priority species for monitoring within BNBA, of which 42 are classified as threatened — 4 mammals, 17 birds, 3 amphibians, 11 reptiles, and 8 plant species (Table ).

# <u>Dumanquillas Bay Protected Landscape and Seascape (DBPLS)</u>

(7°40′22″N, 123°05′46″E)

The Dumanquillas Bay Protected Landscape and Seascape is also one of the ENIPAS-listed site within Zamboanga Sibugay, established in 1999 under Proclamation No. 158. Majority of its jurisdiction, however, lies with the four (4) neighboring municipalities of Zamboanga del Sur, along with the two (2) east coast municipalities of Zamboanga Sibugay — Malangas and Buug. It has a total area of 29,662 ha. consisting of the whole of Dumanquilas Bay and some portions of the land surrounding it, approximately 175.2 km of coastline.

The ecological productivity in Dumanquillas Bay sets up an ideal spawning ground for several species of sardines, making it one of the most productive fishing areas for pelagics in the country. Rapid resource assessments conducted in 2014 recorded 18 mangrove, 8 seagrass, and at least 17 seaweed species throughout the protected area. Mangrove forests, from which many coastal species thrive on including birds, fishes, and invertebrates, were estimated to cover 1,494.62 ha., whereas coral reefs were nearly around 2,000 ha., with some areas observed to have "good" live coral cover<sup>2</sup>.

The protected status of DBPLS enables effective conservation of endemic and threatened species inhabiting the area, as well as their corresponding habitats in both terrestrial and marine environment. Based on assessments by BMS-LAWIN, some notable species in the area that require monitoring and conservation have similarities with the community structure of BNBA, most likely due to its proximity with each other. Threatened marine reptiles such as Hawksbill

turtle *Eretmochelys imbricata* (CR) and Green turtle *Chelonia mydas* (EN) are also listed as priority species within DBPLS (Table \_).

#### Naga-Kabasalan Protected Landscape (NKPL)

(7° 52′ 30″ to 7° 57′ 00″ N; 122° 40′ 37″ to 122° 47′ 35″ E)

Naga-Kabasalan Protected Landscape is a 5,505.44 karst (or limestone) area that is **proposed** for legislation under House Bill No. 5512 in 2017. Some portions of the area contain old-growth closed forests and open forests which are utilized for production, specifically for rubber, high-valued crops, and some fruit trees. Aside from its above-ground vegetation, the unique limestone structure within the demarcated landscape has paved way for the formation of caves, sinkholes, enclosed depressions, disappearing streams, springs, and underground rivers. A total of fourteen (14) caves have, so far, been identified from 2016 to 2019. Eight of these caves have already been assessed and recommended for classification (Table ).

The structural complexity of these cave systems allow several sets of species to live in different niches, depending on specific habitat requirements. For example, cave bats group together in several chambers of the cave. Fruit bats occupy the cave entrance corresponding to the twilight zone, while colonies of insect bats can be observed in more inner parts of the cave. Arachnids (spiders) and insects can also suitably hide within the holes and crevices of the limestone structure. Swiftlets also perch their nests along the walls in selected caverns.

Above-ground, at least 150 species of vascular plants are present, the most common are species from families Begoniaceae and Urticaceae. Trees and low-lying plants from Moraceae, Arecaceae, Rubiaceae, Araceae, and Zingiberaceae are also frequently observed. The need to prioritize the protection of this area stems not only from its unique geological features, but it is also home to several threatened and important species (Table \_). The area is home to native

trees like *Syzygium rubropurpureum*, endemic to only Zamboanga and Basilan, and flowering plants such as *Etlingera philippinensis* which can only be found in the country. Species that require conservation such as White Lauan *Shorea contorta* (CR), *Entada phaseoloides* (OTS), and the Writhed hornbill Rhabdotorrhinus leucocephalus (VU) are also present in the area. Some native ornamentals such as *Hoya carnosa* and *Begonia sp.*, and edible-fruit bearers *Pangium edule* and *Artocarpus sericicarpus* also thrive among the local vegetation.

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## Local conservation areas and other important habitats

Under the context of national laws, certain land categories are required for protection from any form of exploitation including intensive resource extraction, land conversions, and heavy infrastructure activities. These areas cover forestlands, ancestral domains, tenured lands, river buffer zones, steep sloping areas, and caves.

#### Forest canopies

Closed forests usually indicate densely vegetated virgin canopies, and are primarily concentrated around the uplands of Kabasalan where accessibility is limited by its altitude. Open forests which are indicative of secondary growths from prior habitat disturbance are more spread out throughout Zamboanga Sibugay, particularly in high terrain areas of the seven municipalities of Tungawan, RT Lim, Titay, Naga, Kabasalan, Siay, and Buug. Mangrove forests fringe on almost all coastal/estuarine areas of the province (Table \_; Map on Annexes \_).

#### Ancestral lands

Zamboanga Sibugay is a province whose inhabitants are of mixed origins and ethnicities, a significant number comprises of the indigenous people (IP). These communities play a crucial

role in the management of the natural reserves from which they dwell in for centuries long before. They have protected their tribal lands from urban encroachment and have wisely used their resources through sustainable practices that have been passed on as tradition from one generation to the next.

The National Commission on Indigenous People (NCIP) reported an estimated number of IPs at 44,431 individuals in 2005 (9.03% of total population) spread throughout all the municipalities of the province. The most number of indigenous people can be found in Naga (7,035). More recent surveys in 2010<sup>3</sup> have shown growth in IP population, the most common come from the tribes of Subanen (58,069), Tausug (49,573), Kalibugan (9,083), and Sama Bangingi (7,429).

Acknowledging their function in the protection of Sibugay uplands, the IPRA Law (RA 8731) provides the rights of possession and ownership of indigenous peoples over their ancestral domains. As of date, there has been 1 CADT (Certificate of Ancestral Domain Title) awarded to IPs in Kabasalan and 1 CADC (Certificate of Ancestral Domain Claim) allotted for IPs in Titay, each covering an area of 2,073 and 2,124 ha., respectively (Table \_; Maps in Annexes \_). Based on the compiled consultations by the NCIP (Annex \_), roughly 59,797 ha. in land area are occupied by IP communities throughout Zamboanga Sibugay.

#### Tenured lands

Forest tenurial instruments are forms of production sharing agreement between the holder (usually in the private sector) and the government to develop, use, and manage tracts of forestland, or other public and private land to grow timber and non-timber species. In Zamboanga Sibugay, the existing tenurial instruments are Integrated Forest Management Agreement (IFMA), Community-based Forest Management Agreement (CBFMA), and Socialized Industrial Forest Management Agreement (SIFMA), with an aggregate total area of 24,010 ha. of protection/production forests (Table ; Map in Annex ).

These agreements allow utilization of the land resources by skilled citizenry including farmers and IPs, whilst being closely monitored and properly guided by authorized implementors (i.e. DENR and LGU). Close alliances with the private sector have encouraged sustainable practices on agroforestry and other similar activities to be applied to the community level.

#### Mount Kaladis

Other upland areas of ecological significance include Mount Kaladis (Imelda) rising at 604 MASL, hosting Dipterocarp species including White and Red Lauan. The forestland is also home

to the endemic "kaladis narig" (*Vatica elliptica*), wherein only a few stands of the tropical hardwood tree remain here and nowhere else in the world. As part of their corporate social responsibility (CSR), the Energy Development Corporation (EDC) through their nationwide replanting program BINHI, searched and attempted to asexually propagate the remaining stands of kaladis narig in their nursery in Antipolo, continually adjusting soil moisture to match conditions in Mount Kaladis. Efforts have been futile as only one out of fifty (50) cuttings was able to survive<sup>4</sup>. However, for the people working on its conservation, it is an indication that this hardwood species is determined to flourish in Zamboanga.

#### Sibugay Coastal Wetlands

Sibugay coastal wetlands, along with the rest of Sibugay Bay, is a 187,003 ha. vast body of water that supports a large population of wildlife and is a fishery resource supporting nine (9) municipalities along the 146 km. long coastline. It has been regarded as a key habitat that allows tens of millions of shorebirds to migrate from breeding sites in the Northern hemisphere to non-breeding areas in the southern hemisphere. Aside from migratory birds, it is also home to certain species of crabs, mollusks, and fish.

Bats, with estimates of up to 311,000 individuals, take refuge within mangrove reserves of the area. Confirmed species include the Golden-crowned flying-fox *Acerodon jubatus* (CR), and Giant flying-fox *Pteropus vampyrus* (EN). Previous misconception from the local community treated such creatures as pests that deteriorate the health of the mangrove forest. It was only recently that local experts were able to attest the critical role of these bats in ecological productivity, particularly in providing organic material in the form of "guano" or fecal matter. There were also sightings of the iconic Philippine eagle *Pithecophaga jefferyi*, tarsiers *Tarsius syrichta*, flying foxes, dugongs *Dugong dugon*, whale sharks *Rhincodon typus*, saltwater crocodile *Crocodylus porosus*, and five (5) species of marine turtles.

The site is also a haven for birds, proposed as the 5<sup>th</sup> flyway site in the Philippines under the East Asian-Australian Flyway (EAAF) Partnership Network, as well as the 8<sup>th</sup> Ramsar site in the country. Its productive mudflats serve as feeding grounds to sixty-one (61) species of waterbirds, forty-one (41) of which are migratory. Wader flagging/banding methods have assisted in identifying a bird's region of origin, including Russia, China, Japan, and Australia. Some notable species are the Far Eastern Curlew *Numenius madagascariensis* (EN); Ruddy Turnstone *Arenaria interpres* from Bohai, China; Red-necked Stint *Calidris ruficollis* (NT, IUCN) from Chongming Dao, Shanghai, China; and the Great Knot *Calidris tenuirostris* (EN) migrating from Russia at 6,270-km air mileage. Other notable bird species are the Eurasian Curlew *Numenius arquata* (OTS), Black-Tailed Godwit *Limosa limosa* (VU), and Philippine Duck *Anas luzonica* (VU).

#### Marine Protected Areas

Local initiatives on conserving marine biodiversity are already in place in several municipalities through the delineation and effective management of marine protected areas in Zamboanga Sibugay (Table \_). These conservation sites take form in varying types of ecosystems including coral reefs, seagrass beds, mangrove reserves, and shallow wetlands.

**Buluan Island** Marine Sanctuary (Ipil), covering 63 ha, was awarded 1<sup>st</sup> placer for Best Managed MPA in the 5<sup>th</sup> MPA Awards and Recognition or Para El MAR, last 24-October 2015, topping over 200 marine reserves. It is also home to the endangered Fluted Giant Clam *Tridacna squamosa*, along with other reef species.

Previously, **Bangaan Island** MPA (Tungawan), spanning at 880 ha, was also given the same award in 2011. Bangaan Island is listed as <u>one of the KBAs in the country</u> based on conducted assessments and published report by Conservation International in 2006. Live coral cover is estimated at 53% (good) with 19 identified species dominated by *Montipora*, *Acropora*, *Porites*, and Fungia. Seagrass is also present consisting of 4 species (*Enhalus acoroides*, *Thalassia hemprichii*, *Halophila ovalis*, and *Cymodocea rotundata*). An extensive mangrove forest covering 240 ha. also exist within the sanctuary, identified with at least 13 species of mangroves with *Rhizophora apiculata* and *Sonneratia alba* as the most dominant species. The mangrove forest is home to populations of the Golden-crowned headed bat. The calcareous sandy beach also serve as ideal nesting sites for Green Sea Turtle (*Chelonia mydas*) hatchlings.

# **Ecosystem Goods and Services**

Conservation of the Zamboanga Sibugay's biodiversity can only be impact-driven when its stakeholders are aware of the benefits they acquire from these natural resources. They may come in several forms which vary in relevance and appreciation for the communities involved. Tangible products are highly valued for their visibility and direct contribution to basic human needs. Meanwhile, intangible services such as for protection from natural calamities, for climate regulation, as fundamental source of knowledge, and many others, are more complex and are thus undervalued.

Nonetheless, the need to identify and highlight these ecosystem services are necessary to stimulate direct involvement of the concerned communities in protecting their natural assets. Moreover, proper research and development of these biotic resources shall uncover numerous potentials which they can further benefit from, more preferably and even more profitably than traditional unsustainable practices.

For the people of Zamboanga Sibugay, roughly outlined below are some of the identified ecosystem goods and services that the province enjoys:

- Provision of food, water, and other basic needs for domestic use
- Natural habitat for plants, animals, and other organisms
- Source of raw materials for handicraft, furniture, and other similar industries
- Suitable site for cultivation of agroforestry and other related crops
- Generation of income and employment from ecotourism industry
- Buffer from natural calamities such as flooding, landslide, and storm surge
- Sequestration of atmospheric carbon to mitigate climate change trends
- Home and cultural grounds of indigenous communities

#### Protection from environmental hazards

Retaining dense and resilient vegetation especially in the uplands is extremely significant in mitigating possible hydrological consequences such as flooding and landslide events in low-lying areas during heavy rainfall, as well as the protection given by mangroves during storm surges. Areas in Zamboanga Sibugay that are exposed to such hazards are presented in Table (Map in Annex).

#### Forest products

The role of the forests in supplying raw materials is essential for many locals for its direct utilization in households and also as means of livelihood. While the resources that can be derived from the forests of Zamboanga Sibugay are readily available, overexploitation may also lead to irreversible consequences. With this consideration, forest-based industries in Zamboanga Sibugay are regulated. Forest products used for domestic and livelihood purposes include nipa, rattan, and bamboo for housing material, sawali weaving, and split boards. Around 24 local firms are operating in rattan and wood furniture industries in the province, with the most numbers located in Buug (8) and Ipil (5).

Upland forests have also been utilized as production areas, primarily for rubber. Region 9 is the number 1 producer of rubber, where 43.92% of all the country's rubber is sourced from<sup>5</sup>. Zamboanga Sibugay is regarded as the Rubber Capital of the Philippines for both raw and processed products, and houses the Philippine Rubber Research Institute to maximize the industry's potential. Rubber production in the province was estimated at 111,458 MT in 2018, harvested from around 70,220 ha. of plantation<sup>6</sup>. Due to its high prices, tapping of rubber has been the leading income source for upland farmers. At least 16 firms from the rubber industry are registered throughout the province. Other agroforestry-related activities involve growing of fruit trees, coconut, gmelina, and mahogany.

#### Coastal resources

Mangrove forests, seagrass beds, and coral reefs constitute the important coastal habitats in the province. Their high productivity and structural complexity serve as bounteous breeding and feeding grounds for several types of fishes, crustaceans, mollusks, and other invertebrates. Seagrasses can sustain productive levels similar to agricultural croplands. Marine turtles and dugongs also feed here. The structural complexity and rigidity of mangroves, seagrasses, corals can reduce sediment erosion, and at the same time, provide protection to inland communities from tsunamis and storm surges. This is based on personal accounts of local communities in Talusan where an intensity 7 earthquake on August 16, 1976 resulted to a tsunami that claimed hundreds of houses and lives. It was believed that the destruction would have been more devastating if not for the mangroves growing along the coast.

Coastal habitats not only sustain food for the inhabiting flora and fauna, but also for human consumption. The fishing grounds in the province are approximately 366,400 ha. and can

produce as much as 118,051 MT of fish harvest as of 2018<sup>6</sup>. Using simple methods such as multiple hook-and-line, nets, etc., annual fish catch can reach up to 558 MT (for the municipality of Siay alone). The total fish harvest in both commercial and municipal fisheries in the province are recorded at 21,090 MT in 2018. Commonly caught fishes are bangus (milk fish), soldier fish, lizardfish, crevalle, cavallas, emperor fish, striped mackerel, and big-eyed scads, tread breans and goatfish. They are consumed by the local population and/or marketed to neighboring provinces.

Aside from direct harvesting, aquaculture also provide livelihood opportunities for coastal dwellers. In the municipality of Olutanga alone, harvesting of bangus and prawn can reach up to 580 MT in a year. Other marine products grown in the province include tilapia, mud crabs, siganid (Danggit), abalone, caulerpa (Lato), lobster, sugpo, samaral (Kitong), among others. In 2018, aquaculture production (aside from seaweed) reached up to 3,177 MT for the whole province.

Seaweed farming comprises the huge bulk of fishery resources in Zamboanga Sibugay. Up to 93,784 MT was harvested in 2018, or 79% of the total fishery production. Along with the neighboring provinces, Region 9 accounts for 12% production of seaweed nationally, ranking 3<sup>rd</sup> among all other regions in the country. Agar-agar, a type of seaweed, is produced at 3850 MT/year in Mabuhay, and 3520 MT/year in Olutanga. It is produced and exported as dried seaweed and semirefined and refined carageenan. They are processed and are used mostly for cosmetics and food processing<sup>5</sup>.

#### **Ecotourism**

The relatively pristine and undisturbed landand seascapes in Zamboanga Sibugay presents a huge potential for inviting tourists eager to witness first-hand the unique biodiversity thriving in the province. Despite the setbacks in the tourism industry pressed on by threats of insurgencies, intensified security measures and active campaigns on its natural features have resulted to exponential growth of visitors coming in the province in the past few years (Figure \_). In 2018, there were a total of 85,846 tourists in the province, 86 from foreign countries. This was an abrupt increase from 2015



levels which was only at around 4,027 individuals<sup>6</sup>. The low number of foreign tourists are attributed mostly to travel restrictions in Mindanao areas, stipulated by their respective country.

Protected areas which boasts in biodiversity are being developed for their ecotourism potentials. Although there are certain portions which are inaccessible to public for conservation purposes, designated areas are in place for certain activities that can generate income to sustain the management and development of the protected area, as well as provide livelihood for its local caretakers — guided ecotourism is one of these activities. In BNBA for instance, the recreational value in the area is conducive for mountaineering activities such as mountain climbing and trekking, camping, hiking and educational tours. If lucky enough, interesting flora and fauna which can rarely be seen nowhere else may be encountered during the tour.

The caves of NKPL have also started to open up for tourists such as the **Tipan Underground Cave**. The interiors of the cave can be comparable to cathedrals in size, with some sections running through underground rivers. The trip requires the expertise of its local communities who are formally trained as tourist guides, ensuring both the safety and amusement of its visitors. Currently, Tipan Underground Cave is subject for formal recognition as an ecotourism site under House Bill 4979 to secure appropriate funds for its maintenance and development.

Another primary attraction which highlights the coastal diversity of Zamboanga Sibugay is a trip around **Kabug (Siay-Kabasalan) Mangrove Park and Wetlands**. The boat-ride around the mangrove swamp and wetlands showcases several wildlife, most notably the thousands of birds that forage on the shallow mudflats, of which several species are considered migratory. It is inspired by this attraction that the 1<sup>st</sup> World Migratory Bird Day was celebrated here on October 2018, inviting several visitors from within and outside the country. Aside from birds, resident bats also number in hundreds of thousands among the mangrove stands. They are visible as swarms in the sky during sunset to look for food, then come back to their roosting sites before sunrise. Siay-Kabasalan Wetlands is also currently proposed for legislation as an ecotourism site under House Bill 8612, submitted November 19, 2018.

Other ecotourism sites in the province include the several MPAs such as Buluan Island near the capital Ipil, which offers healthy reefs ideal for snorkeling and SCUBA diving. Trekking through the upland areas may also lead to several rivers and falls such as Malagandis and Cubacob Falls in Titay, and Malubal Falls in R.T. Lim (House Bill 7429, March 20, 2018), to name a few.

# Issues, Needs, Problems, and Threats in the Biodiversity Areas

#### Forest extraction

During the 70's and 80's, an intensive logging boom emerged in the province which drastically reduced their natural forest cover. For instance, records reveal Imelda originally had pristine forest covering 4,644.92 ha., but is now reduced to only 27.32-ha open forests<sup>7</sup>. The previously 30,000-ha of forest canopy in Tungawan has been cut down to only 13,415 ha as of 2011<sup>8</sup>. Upland areas of Naga and Olutanga is now even devoid of natural forest cover. In many areas, native Dipterocarp trees and other premium timber is now hard to find. Although efforts on curbing down illegal logging activities have already been strictly enforced, timber poaching and the practice of "slash-and-burn" for agricultural conversion still exists due to meager income of the locals. Transport of Falcata trees were once intercepted and apprehended while passing through greater Poblacion of Kabasalan<sup>9</sup>.

This overexploitation of the forest resources has since deteriorated watershed capabilities and aggravated river siltation and flooding especially in the lowlands. Worse, this has resulted to habitat loss of many birds, monkeys and other wildlife. Due to poverty, some of wild animals are even caught as alternate food source via airgun and/or indigenous trapping device (snare).

#### Mangrove conversion

Along coastlines, a huge portion of the forestlands belong to mangroves. Initiatives from the local government and community on active plantation and conservation have continually increased its cover throughout the years. However, in certain areas where decrease was observed, they are usually attributed to conversion of mangroves to fishponds. If such developments are left unchecked, they can affect natural drainage systems and the breeding chain of nearby marine resources.

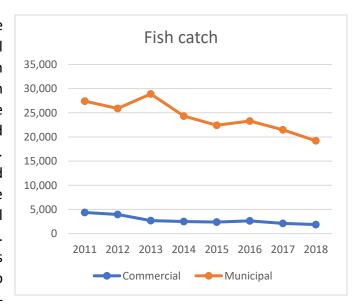
Fish catch decline

Bordering the north part of the Moro Gulf, Zamboanga Sibugay provincial waters are teeming with life. Although records show decreased fish production in the past years (Figure \_). From 2011, the municipal fish harvest has slowly dropped down from 27,407 to 19,210 MT in 2018. Commercial harvest has also been reduced from 4,377 to 1,880 MT of the same period<sup>6</sup>. This can be attributed to several factors, both natural and human-induced. Ineffective fishery law enforcement has allowed unsustainable practices to continue such as the use of sudsod, fine-



mesh nets, chemicals, compressor, and dynamite. Nowadays, dynamite fishing is even harder to regulate because they already use delayed-detonation and sinkers to silence the blast from the surface.

Dead corals are also observed in areas where there is high siltation due to illegal quarrying<sup>10</sup>. These cascading ridge-to-reef effects are further aggravated by unsustainable farming practices that use inorganic fertilizers and insecticides whose run-off can poison marine resources.

#### Climate change

The threat of climate change exists and can worsen atmospheric conditions, manifesting in more frequent typhoons, occurrence of El Niño and La Niña, and higher ranges of temperature and rainfall. These manifestations can largely impact important ecosystems such as rainforests of which vegetation has a strong dependency to its water resource and where temperature changes can directly affect living communities especially to highly-sensitive species. The extensive coastlines in the region are also vulnerable to the effects of climate change such as sealevel rise, ocean warming and acidification, and other cascading effects which eventually result to depopulation of its coastal inhabitants. Despite the change being gradual, its presence is already felt and documented in the region across all habitats.

The effects of climate change is already apparent during the massive **coral bleaching** that occurred in Bangaan Marine Sanctuary on March 24-26, 2012, resulting to decline in fish stocks<sup>8</sup>. Buluan Island Marine Sanctuary also experienced the same bleaching phenomenon on June 27, 2016. Climate change projections should be given utmost consideration in planning and development of Zamboanga Peninsula, especially because they are the 2<sup>nd</sup> most vulnerable region (in terms of land area) to 1-m sea level rise. Such scenario will leave 3,274.02 ha. of Zamboanga Sibugay underwater<sup>5</sup>. Climate Central, Inc. uses CoastalDEM (digital elevation model) from remotely-sensed (satellite) data to generate maps on areas that will be submerged beneath projected sea-level rise and annual flooding. The map in Annex \_ shows coastal areas in Zamboanga Sibugay that are at risk of being inundated from sea-level rise in 2050<sup>12</sup> (default settings).

# Current Governance and Management Regimes and Programs

To preserve and/or improve the current biodiversity assets of Zamboanga Sibugay, the province and respective local government units and agencies formulated policies that allow the community to actively participate and generate awareness on the conservation of natural resources. Areas which were previously left denuded by rampant logging and fishpond conversion are now rehabilitated through the National Greening Program (NGP) and other related projects. Indigenous trees are stocked as seedlings in nurseries managed by local farmer organizations, until they are transplanted in designated areas in the uplands. In some cases, trees such as rubber, cacao, and other fruit trees are also propagated for production purposes using sustainable CBFM practices. Small but significant increases in forest cover was observed from 2010 to 2015, 146 ha. for closed and 162 ha. for open forests<sup>6</sup>.

Mangrove plantations have also been active around Sibugay. Once barren mudflats have been converted to canopies of mangrove forests, where both people and wildlife enjoy the benefits of a flourishing ecosystem. Despite not being considered as natural growth, these plantations have even invited the two species of bats (*P. vampirus* and *A. jubatus*) to serve as roosting-breeding sites and is continually being monitored by the local government protecting it from human disturbances and habitat loss. At least 1,342 ha. of mangrove cover increase was recorded between 2010 and 2015<sup>6</sup>.

In Siay, unsustainable fishing practices such as "bungsod" are now removed, which reportedly resulted to higher fish catch among small fishermen. Regulation on lobster and other crustacean harvest is being implemented by imposing harvest ban from month to month, allowing such species to grow naturally and proliferate.

# **Planning Process**

The localization of BSAP in Zamboanga Sibugay took off on 1-2 August 2019, during the Consultation-workshop for the preparation of a Provincial/City BSAP for Zamboanga Sibugay and Zamboanga City. The 2-day activity was aimed at presenting the history and rationale of PBSAP, as well as forming the initial actions plan that can address the biodiversity targets on the local level. The activity was attended by representatives from DENR Region 9, Zamboanga City LGU, PENRO Zamboanga Sibugay, CENRO Zamboanga City, DENR-BMB, and the academe.

Cascaded down to the local planning and implementing agents, the formulation of Zamboanga Sibugay Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan was formally conducted on 28-30 October 2019 in Zamboanga City, with the active participation of the local managers including representatives from DENR-R9, local government officials in the provincial and municipal levels, PENRO, CENRO, and MENRO personnel, and the academe. The event was aimed to identify which biodiversity targets (20 Aichi Biodiversity Targets) are applicable in the province, and the corresponding activities to address them. It is important that the local targets are specific, measurable, attainable, realistic, and timely (SMART) targets, therefore baseline data and indicators also have to be specified. Once the activities are set, the cost estimates for implementation of every activity should also be accounted for. The planning event was assisted by representatives from DENR-BMB, with technical support of the Protect Wildlife Project-USAID and Biodiversity Finance Initiative (BIOFIN).

One of the decisions that was drawn from the activity was the need for the creation of a Technical Working Group (TWG) tasked primarily for the localization of BSAP in Zamboanga Sibugay. The TWG was formally created in 15-June 2020 under EO. 1011-015, s.2020 (Annex \_), signed by its Chairman, the Provincial Governor himself. Other members of the TWG are the Provincial Board Member, Provincial Planning and Development Coordinator (PPDO), and DENR-PENRO. It also involved representatives from the DENR-R9, DENR-CENROs, MENROs, Protected Area Superintendent (BNBA), BFAR, NCIP, Provincial Agriculturist, Provincial Veterinarian, CSOs and the academe (Universidad de Zamboanga-Ipil). The participative involvement of each stakeholder ensured that every sector is well-represented, target activities are systematic such that all possible conflicting issues are addressed, and accountability in its implementation is fully-recognized.

Subsequent consultative workshops were conducted to address the data needs and enhance the work and financial plans for the Zamboanga Sibugay BSAP. Some of the activities were derived from previously existing environmental plans forwarded by respective local government units, protected area management, and other concerned agencies, to be mainstreamed into a single comprehensive document that would entail all biodiversity-related interventions to be implemented in Zamboanga Sibugay.

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# Zamboanga Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan and Biodiversity Finance Plan

The Zamboanga Sibugay BSAP is a set of targets, priority actions, specific indicators, and budget requirements for managing the province's biodiversity assets, implemented over a 9-year period (2020-202). It is guided by the 20 national targets under the PBSAP which are holistically clustered in 5 major priorities, namely: supporting biodiversity conservation, sustaining ecosystem services, promoting human well-being, reducing threats to biodiversity, and addressing drivers of threats.

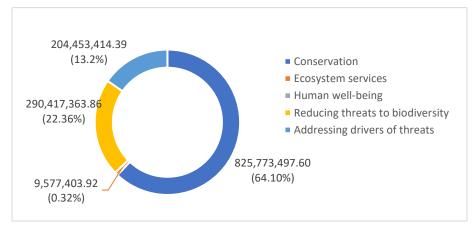


Figure \_. Overall budget allocation per clustered targets

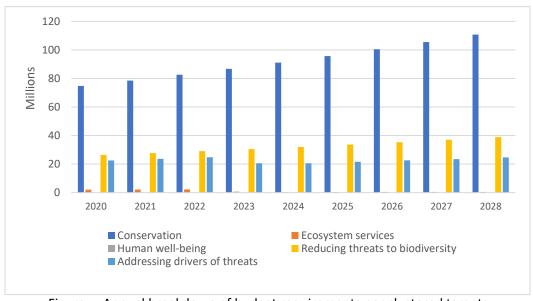


Figure \_. Annual breakdown of budget requirements per clustered targets

# AN ORDER CREATING A TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP (TWG) FOR THE FORMULATION OF LOCALIZED BIODIVERSITY STRATEGY AND ACTION PLAN OF ZAMBOANGA SIBUGAY

WHEREAS, the Local Government Code of 1991 (Republic Act No. 7160) provides the local government units the power, authority, responsibility and resources to be able to enjoy and attain their fullest development as self-reliant communities and be effective partners in the attainment of national goals;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code provides that "every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare." Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology;

WHEREAS, the Philippine Government pursued an initiative of having a long term National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan. This resulted in the formulation of the Philippine Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (PBSAP) 2015-2028 which was officially adopted by virtue of DENR Administrative Order (DAO) No. 2018-12 issued last June 13, 2018. However, the DAO requires that the PBSAP be cascaded to Provincial/City and Municipal levels;

WHEREAS, The Protect Wildlife and the Biodiversity Management Bureau, DENR are partners in the implementation of the PBSAP Project. Institutional support to BMB is one of the assistance areas under strengthening from 2019 to 2020, and support to the localization of the PBSAP is one of them. Four pilot sites to implement the process framework developed by the Project and BMB (and BioFIN) include Zamboanga City, Zamboanga Sibugay, South Cotabato and Aurora Province:

whereas, a follow through of the workshop was conducted on August 1-2, 2019 involving DENR IX and field offices (PENRO Zamboanga Sibugay and CENRO Zamboanga City) and a Consultation Workshop was conducted last October 28-30, 2019 involving DENR IX key Officials, concerned LGUs, Academe, CSOs and private/business sector representatives;

WHEREAS, the outputs during the Oct. 28-30, 2019 workshop are incomplete and need collegial review for refinements. The review is necessary to solidify conservation concerns. Given the limited time and the tedious tasks involved to prepare a clean draft of the local BSAP, there is a need to Create a Technical Working Group (TWG) in order to formulate the BSAP

of Zamboanga Sibugay and to complete it up to its legitimization by the Provincial Development Council and the Sangguniang Panlalawigan;

NOW THEREFORE, I ATTY. WILTER PALMA, Provincial Governor of the Province of Zamboanga Sibugay, by virtue of the power vested in me by law, do hereby create and establish the Technical Working Group (TWG), tasked to take the lead in the formulation of Localized Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan of Zamboanga Sibugay.
