Coastal waters with shallow shoals and banks. Two large lagoons. Several islands are cultivated lands with scattered habitation. The long and narrow peninsula of Knudshoved Odde has some cultivated areas and scattered habitation. Commons, salt marshes, reed swamps and woodland.

<u>Criterion 6:</u> The site regularly supports more than 1% of the individuals in the populations of the following species (count data 1999):

Mute Swan (*Cygnus olor*) 3,752 - 1,8% of the Northwest Mainland & Central Europe population Whooper Swan (*Cygnus cygnus*) 602 - 1,5% of the NW Mainland Europe population Tufted Duck (*Aythya fuligula*) 11,490 - 1,1% of the Northwestern Europe population Red Breasted Merganser (*Mergus serrator*) 1,815 - 1,5% of the NW/Central Europe population Coot (*Fulica atra*) 20,450 - 1,4% of the Northwestern Europe (win) population

Important locality in Denmark for Tufted Duck. Wintering area for rare raptors. Avnø Fjord is a breeding area and haul-out for Common Seal. Rich marine fauna.

The site is resting and feeding area for waterbirds (count data from 1999): Bean Goose (*Anser fabalis*) 47 Barnacle Goose (*Brante leucopsis*) 260 Goosander (*Mergus merganser*) 370 Golden Plover (*Pluvialis apricaria*) 10,500

Breeding area for aquatic and salt marsh birds including raptors, Recurvirostra avosetta and terns.

Factors (past, present or potential) adversely affecting the site's ecological character, including changes in land use and development projects: (a) at the site (b) around the site All salt marshes are managed – except on Avnø. The overgrowth of the commons on Knudshoved Odde has been dealt with during 2000-2001.

A potential threat is boating and other leisure activities, especially in Karrebæk Fjord. The water quality is still relatively good, but degraded water quality could be a threat.

23. Conservation measures taken: (national category and legal status of protected areas - including any boundary changes which have been made: management practices; whether an officially approved management plan exists and whether it has been implemented) Nature conservation: Enø, Dybsø, Knudshoved, and Stejlebanken, about 300 hectares. Saltmarshes and reed swamps along Dybsø Fjord (195 hectares) were protected in1988. Aunø has recently been protected

by the nature conservation act.

In cooperation with private owners the Storstrøm County has re-established former management, especially extensive grazing of the saltmarshes, in order to provide better conditions for breeding and staging waterbirds.

The whole area is identical with the EU Bird Protection Area No. 81. The site overlaps the EU Habitat Protection Site No. 148.

A Wildlife reserve has been established at Krageholm Strøm and Hestevåd including areas of no hunting and no public access in the breeding season of waterbirds.

24. Conservation measures proposed but not yet implemented: (e.g. management plan in preparation; officially proposed as a protected area etc.)

Aunø has recently been protected by the nature conservation act and has been taken over by the Ministry of Environment. A management plan is under preparation to restore the salt marshes.
