INFORMATION SHEET ON RAMSAR WETLANDS

Country: Sweden

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Name of wetland: Tjålmejaure - Laisdalen

Date of Ramsar designation: 5 December 1974

Geographical coordinates: 66°15'N 16°11'E

General location: Near Pieljekaise National Park (to the north) and the Norwegian border (to the west) in the southwest of the County of Norrbotten.

Area: 21,400 ha

Wetland type: M S U V L O X

Altitude: Maximum 1080 m, minimum 460 m.

Overview: Laisdalen is one of the richest mountain valleys in Sweden in terms of animal species. Through this valley the geographical distribution of several species is extended into the mountainous area.

Physical features: The site covers two mountain valleys which converge above Lake Yraf, and includes a delta formed in the lake by the combined rivers. The southern of the two valleys contains a series of lakes with wide, flat shores. The northern valley, Laisdalen, is much narrower.

Ecological features: Either side of the river is bordered by Betula woods with a sparse element of old Pinus sylvestris, which brings the characteristics out of a virigin forest.

Land tenure/ownership of

- a) site: state-owned.
- b) surrounding area: state-owned.

Conservation measures taken: Listed as site of national importance for nature conservation. The designated site includes two Nature Reserves: Plassa (31 May 1988) and Yrafdeltat (6 May 1974), totallying 1,290 ha. The major part of the site (17,800 ha) is a Bird Sanctuary (Tjålmejaure, 17 Feb 1967).

Conservation measures proposed but not yet implemented: no information supplied.

Current land use: principal human activities in

- a) site: Reindeer husbandry; nature conservation; fishing; hiking (the King's Trail (Kungsleden) passes through the site).
- b) surroundings/catchment: The site lies between the nature Reserve Vindelfjällen and the National Park Pieljekaise.

Disturbances/threats, including changes in land use and major development projects

- a) at the site: Forestry may be a future threat within parts of the site.
- b) in the surroundings/catchment: no information supplied.

Hydrological and physical values: The hydrological system is unaffected by exploitation for hydro-electrical purposes.

Social and cultural values: no information supplied.

Noteworthy fauna: Breeding birds: Limicola falcinellus, Calidris maritima, Gallinago media, Nyctea scandiaca, Anthus cervinus, Lagopus lagopus (extremely productive region), Bombycilla garrulus, Perisoreus infaustus, Tetrao urogallus (ususally abundant), Aquila chrysaetos, Buteo lagopus, Pandion haliaetus, falco Columbarius, Falco rusticolus, Turdus torguatus, Anser erythropus (probably due to reintroduction in adjacent areas). Other fauna: Gulo gulo, Ursus arctos, Lynx lynx, Martes martes.

Noteworthy flora: no information supplied.

Current scientific research and facilities: no information supplied.

Current conservation education: no information supplied.

Current recreation and tourism: The King's Trail (Kungsleden), which is a hiking path from North to South through the Swedish mountains, passes through the Laisdalen valley.

Management authority: The managers of the Nature Reserves are: Plassa NR - County Administration
Yrafdeltat NR - County Forestry Board
Outside reserves it's the landowner himself who manages the land.

Jurisdiction: Territorial and functional: County Administration of Norrbotten.
